Philosophy Themes

Transport Services for next academic year 2018/2019

In planning for the transport arrangements for John Scottus Secondary School for the next academic year (2018-19) a major consideration for us has been our wish to continue to show appreciation for the great parental support and faith in our school that was evident during the move to our new location. In recognition of this the free transport arrangements that have been in place this year will continue in the next academic year. Specifically:

 City Centre (N11) and M50 routes will continue free of charge next year. They will bring students to school for the start of the school day and will depart at the end of the school day.

- Shuttle buses to and from DART (Shankill stop), LUAS (Brides Glen stop) and Shankill at start and end of school day will continue next year free of charge.
- There will also be a bus picking up students from the DART (Shankill stop) and LUAS (Brides Glen stop) who miss transport links before 9.00 am in order to ensure they are in time for their second class.

Please note that this provision of free transport cannot continue indefinitely and after the next academic year, which is from August 2019, there will be an introduction of bus charges. Detail on this will be forwarded to parents later in 2018.

Junior Cycle Update

An information evening took place on the new Junior Cycle on Wednesday March 14th. An overview was given of the changes taking place and in particular how assessment is changing.

For 3rd years, the French Orals have taken place, the Irish Orals will take place the week of April 9th, and by the end of April the Science, CSPE and Art project work will have been completed.

As part of the new Junior Cycle, each student will receive, on completion of 3rd year, a Junior Cycle Profile of Achievement. This will document, in addition to the exam results,

other areas of learning and standards achieved in continuous assessment tasks and short courses. Our Transition Year students completed their reflections before their trip to India. These Junior Cycle Profile of Achievement Certificates have now been posted and you should receive them in the next few days.

Child Protection

The Children's First Act, 2015 and the recent Children First: National Guidance for the Protection and Welfare of Children published in 2017 places new statutory obligations on all teachers and schools.

Timetable next year

There will a small change to the timetable next year with the school day starting at 8.20 and finishing at 3.40pm, with an early finish of 12.45 on Wednesday. The changes will facilitate a dedicated period of time for assembly and class teacher time every day. It would also allow more time for sport on Wednesday afternoon. This change does in result in any loss of tuition time. Please note there will be no lunch provided on Wednesday.

School closed during storm Emma

To ensure that students are not adversely affected by the missed school days due to storm Emma, we will be making some changes in the next few months. Some examples of this are 6th years will finish school on Friday May 25th instead of May 18th, 3rd years will have classes up until June 1st and for other years tuition will take place up to the last day of school before class trips take place. We are confident that these changes along with others will ensure that tuition time lost will be recovered.

Learning and Teaching

We are continuing to place a huge emphasis on the way feedback to students is given and how students reflect on that feedback. After the recent exams each student received a cover sheet identify some strengths, areas of improvements and a space to reflect on what future actions need to take place. In addition we have introduced a policy where teachers correct in red and students need to comment on corrections in green. We hope this emphasis on feedback will develop in our students the habit of reflection and increase the rate of learning.
