# **February Exams**

The February exams for all students have just finished. Reports on progress will be ready for most students by the beginning of March. However, the  $3^{rd}$  and  $6^{th}$  year students may have to wait a little longer as exam scripts have been sent out to be externally marked.

# **Transport Fees for 2019/2020**

For the past two years, in acknowledgement of the parents who have supported the school's move to Old Conna, free buses have been provided to transport students to and from school. This is obviously not sustainable in the long term and as indicated in correspondence in December, transport fees would be introduced for the academic year 2019/2020. Please note that after the mid-term we be asking if parents and students are interested in signing up to the various routes.

#### **Buildings Update**

This winter, we have organized all P.E classes to take place in Old Conna using the various rooms available. This has been very beneficial to our students as more time as it gives more time for the actual P.E classes. Future plans for the campus include the development of the swimming pool and external lightning. Work is also been done on how it may be possible to connect the school to public transport. The Local Area Development Plans provides for a footpath on Ferndale road, and a parent group is looking at how to accelerate this process. ## **School Improvement Plan**

After an extensive self-evaluation process involving students, teachers, parents and members of the Board of Management and Boards of Trustees a School Improvement Plan has been drafted. The plan identifies a number of key areas that the school will focus on over the next few years. Four areas relate to learning and teaching: Feedback, Questioning, Literacy and Numeracy; and two relate to well-being: Extra-curricular activities and the Mentoring Programme.
