## **Child Protection**

The Children's First Act, 2015 and the recent Children First: National Guidance for the Protection and Welfare of Children published in 2017 places new statutory obligations on all teachers and schools. It also requires the school to produce a Child Safe Guarding Statement by March which will replace the existing school Child Protection Policy. To ensure all teachers and school personnel receive training in the new legislation, the Department of Education and Skills has requested schools close for two half days.

## **Junior Cycle Profile of Achievement.**

As part of the new Junior Cycle, each student will receive, on completion of 3<sup>rd</sup> year, a Junior Cycle Profile of Achievement. This will document, in addition to the exam results, other areas of learning and standards achieved in continuous assessment tasks and short courses. Our Transition Year students completed their reflections before their trip to India and on their return will receive their Junior Cycle Profile of Achievement Certificates.

## **Substitute Teachers**

You may have heard recently in the news about the shortage of teachers in the secondary school sector. This has not really affected the school until recently when Mr. Telford went to India with the Transition Year students. Despite much endeavour, we were unable to find one teacher to cover all of his French classes. Classes did continue, however in a few cases, the teacher covering the class would not have been a specialist in the language. Going forward, we will put measures in place to ensure that if any

subject learning has been missed, students will have the opportunity to catch up.

### **Strategic Plan**

The school is currently formulating a plan for the future development of the school. Your input is much appreciated and if you would like to get involved in the process please let me know.

### **Transport**

When announcing the move to Old Conna last year, the commitment was given to provide transport free for the first year. Currently discussions are taking place to see if this will continue for another year or if there will be a charge. Regardless of these discussions, please note that the same transport routes currently on offer this year will also be in operation for the next school year. If you would like to be part of the parent transport sub-committee looking at these issues, please let me know.

### **Astro-pitch**

It is with great delight that we can announce that a new surface is being ordered for the astro-pitch. This will be ready after Easter. This will be a fantastic addition to the Old Conna campus as it will facilitate the playing of hockey, football, tennis, basketball and other sports all year round. In practical terms, this will mean that nearly all of our Physical Education classes will take place on site in Old Conna and that most of Wednesday afterschool sport will also take place in Old Conna.

### **Policies – Catering, Admissions**

The Board of Management has recently reviewed and approved two policies: the Catering and Admissions Policy. Please note that if for medical reasons, a child needs to bring a packed lunch, a packed lunch form needs to be completed and returned to the Deputy Principal at the start of each term. ### **Evolving Family Workshops**

The last of the Evolving Family Workshops took place on Saturday Jan 27<sup>th</sup>. The topic was Philosophy Stories for Children and over 70 people registered for the event. The series was a great success and we hope to continue the workshops next year.

### **Learning and Teaching**

Currently we have two areas of focus: feedback and literacy.

With feedback, we are looking at the way feedback is given, the types of feedback and the strategies that help students act on feedback. Asking students to complete reflections on their November exams and talking about these reflections at the class-

teacher meetings in January was one example of initiatives in this area. For the exams that just finished last week, each student will receive a cover sheet describing an area of strength and of improvement. We hope this initiative will develop in our students the habit of reflection and increase the rate of learning.

The other area of focus is literacy. The particular focus we have is in increasing student confidence about speaking aloud in class. We intend to conduct further surveys later in the year to determine if the various strategies being employed have raised the levels of confidence in speaking.

### **Exams**

The February exams for all students have just finished. Reports on progress will be ready for most students by the beginning of March. However the exam year students may have to wait a little longer as exams have been sent out to be externally marked.

### **Junior Cycle Wellbeing Course**
