February Exams

Phones/Smart Watches

We have updated our ICT behaviour policy to specifically prohibit the use of Smart watches which facilitate the use of Social media and texting. Just a reminder of our ICT Policy:

All use of technology should be for the support of learning. ICT devices are to be used (e.g. tablets, notebooks, laptops, headphones, smart watches etc.) only under teacher supervision. Teachers will confiscate ICT devices when there are misused. Devices confiscated will be placed in the School Office for 3 days. After 3 days the parent/guardian of the student may reclaim the device. If the parent/guardian of the student has not reclaimed the device within 7 days, it will be returned to the student after the 7 days.

We have organised replacement teachers for all classes who will continue to implement the lesson plans in all subjects.
