Study Skills Seminar Day

On Nov 5th, our 3rd and 6th years attended a study skills seminar hosted by Sean Kelly (see details <u>here</u>). The feedback from students was very positive and the strategies covered in the workshop will be developed further throughout the year.

Questioning Strategy

Our Questioning Improvement Strategy has set out three targets.

Increase active learning in class through appropriate questioning - In practice this involves asking students to "do" something with content through appropriate questioning. For example, pick out the main 3 points of a paragraph.

Create a culture of questioning - We encourage our students to discover that the best idea is more important than winning an argument, that good questions are more important than lengthy speeches, to be willing to listen to others and to be happy to be proved wrong.

Develop range of questioning that embraces higher and lower order question - Bloom's Taxonomy is used as a framework to ensure different levels of questions are asked. For example some questions involved the recall of knowledge such as when did an event happen, while other questions involved developing opinions or judgements such as asking students to compare or evaluate.
