Literacy Strategy

Our Literacy Improvement Strategy has set out four targets.

- 1. Reduce number of students that dislike reading out loud in class
- 2. Increase number of students that spend more than an hour per week reading at home
- 3. Increase confidence about speaking aloud in class
- $4. \ Increase \ numbers \ of \ students \ that \ check \ their \ spelling, \ grammar \ and \ choice \ of \ words \ before \ submitting \ written \ work$

To help reach these targets we ask all parents to support reading time at home and to donate any appropriate books for the drop everything and read times.

Transition Year Update
