Annual Bursary Policy



This policy will be available to view and examine by all members of the school community: Parents, Staff, Board of Management and Trustees. They will be available for inspection in the Pre-school classroom in Old Conna, Ferndale Rd, Rathmichael, Co Dublin and on our School website.

The JSPPS is a school within the John Scottus Educational Trust. It is covered by the Charities legislation of the State. Any Bursary awarded will be reviewed with the recipients on an annual basis.

A Bursary may be provided to a family who currently has a child in the School, or has applied and has been accepted to have a child or children in the School.

A request for a reduced fee is likely to be made by parents who are unable to meet the fees of the School for one of the following reasons:

- 1. They are new to the School, greatly value the ethos of the school, but are unable to pay the full fee.
- 2. Are existing parents whose financial circumstances have changed negatively to the point they are unable to afford the full fee.
- 3. Have one or more children in the School, want another of their children to attend but cannot afford the full fee for the new child.

To be considered for a Bursary, the following steps need to take place:

- 1. A Bursary Application form is filled out, and presented to the Head Teacher of the JSPPS before 31st March in the year the child is to start.
- 2. The form is submitted by the Head Teacher with a written recommendation from the Head Teacher, to the Bursar of Board of Management of the JSPPS.
- 3. The Bursar of the BoM will talk directly to the signatories on the Application, to learn about the financial situation that has bought about this request.
- 4. The BoM will hear the Bursar's recommendation and decide on the basis of:
 - a. The School's ability to allow this Bursary, and the amount thereof.
 - b. The consequences, for the family and the School, of disallowing a Bursary.
 - c. The overall added value to the School of allowing this Bursary to go ahead.

The decision of the Board will be communicated to the Parents by the Bursar.

A successful family will accept the need for review of their Bursary where the there is a change in their circumstances , or in the School's financial circumstances.

Note:

- 1. JSPPS has no fund from which a Bursary may be awarded. Its only income is fee-based. Any Bursary that is provided to a family is an expense that the School itself has to carry, and so is granted only where there is a clear case of need.
- 2. Where there is more than one application, and not all can be approved, the guiding rules will apply:
 - a. the date on which the application was made
 - b. the financial need of the family applying
 - c. the value of the school to the parent on an ethos-fit basis.
