We have arrived at our mid-term after a very eventful first term, and I would like to take this opportunity to share a few notices with you.

Philosophy Themes

Whole school assemblies have continued online for the past month. In addition to regular updates on school events, we have explored various questions such as:

Philosophy and Self-Discovery Week

Philosophy week, with the theme "Does our speech uplift" took place the week beginning Monday, January 24. The week culminated in the Philosophy Fair presentations, where students with the best philosophical projects from each class presented to the rest of the school. In the weeks before Philosophy week, students in all classes prepared a presentation on their chosen philosophical question. Well done to Adam, who won the Junior award with "How would humans react if society collapsed?" and to Afshin and Sam, who were runners up with the topic of "Is beauty a fact or just taste". Well done to Katie, who won the Senior award with "Can Science explain everything" and to Anahita and Kaede, who were runners up with the topic of "Can humans be perfect".

We are still awaiting guidance from the Department of Education on Covid-19 restrictions. We will consider the directions received when the school reopens after mid-term and make appropriate changes where possible.

February Assessment

In-school exams, including the mock exams for 3rd year and 6th year, have taken place over the past week. We hope that these reports will show what learning has occurred in the previous two months.

We moved to our new location in Old Conna in 2017, and our profile in the area has dramatically increased. The increase in the school's profile is mostly due to word of mouth. We held an online Open Morning on Thursday, January 27, for parents enrolling children for August 2023. We had an excellent turnout, and we also expect to have very strong enrolment into 1st year of August 2023.

The Awards are given in various disciplines/ fields of activities: art, social work, public affairs, science and engineering, trade and industry, medicine, literature and education, sports, and civil service. Mr Kortenhorst was one of only ten people of a nationality other than Indian to get an award. Well done Mr Kortenhorst.

Chemistry Olympiad
